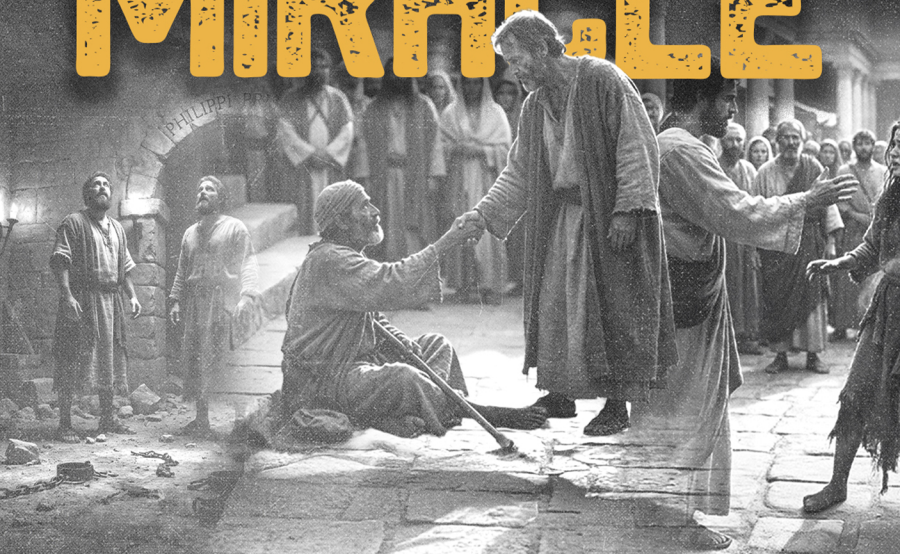

Acts of the Holy Spirit

21 DAYS OF MIRACLES

Fasting is physical deprivation for spiritual preparation. Throughout Scripture, God consistently calls His people to set aside natural appetites in order to heighten spiritual awareness. Moses fasted forty days on Mount Sinai before receiving the Law that would govern a nation. Ezra proclaimed a fast before the people returned from exile, seeking God's protection and favor as they rebuilt their future. Daniel humbled himself with a three-week fast so that he might receive understanding and clarity from Heaven. Even Jesus fasted forty days before stepping into public ministry—because power always flows from preparation. In the early Church, Paul and Barnabas fasted as the Holy Spirit set leaders apart and advanced the mission of the Gospel.

Fasting does not twist God's arm—it tunes our hearts to His voice. When the body weakens, the spirit sharpens.

As we step into these next 21 days of fasting and prayer, let us do so with faith, perseverance, and an unshakable belief that God will move powerfully among us. What He does in this season has the potential to reshape our hearts, our Church, and our entire world.

1. The Miracle of Power – Acts 2

Acts 2:4 (ESV) And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

The miracle of Pentecost is the first and most important miracle of the Christian. God, the Father, empowering ordinary people for an extraordinary mission. The Church circled the globe as a result of this one moment. What could God do through this fasting campaign through the Holy Spirit! The possibilities are beyond our imagination (Ephesians 3:20).

Remember, before the Church ever preached, served, gave, or evangelized, they waited on the Lord (see Luke 24:49). There is a patient firmness in Acts 2 that prepares the way for Divine operation. Personal revival begins when God fills what we offer to Him. This fast is an offering of your whole self to God. Let's start by waiting before the Lord BEFORE you work. If you've already been busy today, don't stress; take some time to get away from screens and stresses to let God clothe you with power that does not come from you.

Prayer: "Father, I ask for the Holy Spirit. I claim the promise of Luke 11 that You would give Him to those who ask Him. I know I cannot do what You have for me to do without You. I humble myself before You and seek Your face. Send Your Holy Spirit fully into my body. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

2. The Miracle of Restoration – Acts 3

Acts 3:6 (ESV) But Peter said, I have no silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!

Before we can run, we need to walk! This miracle is both a testament to the legitimacy of the Apostles' Gospel message AND a picture of our faith in Christ. Only in Christ's Name can we truly walk in life. The beauty of this miracle is that Peter didn't offer what he lacked; he offered what God had freely given him - the POWER of Jesus' Name. Miracles begin when we stop focusing on what we don't have and start stewarding what God has placed in our hands. Jesus empowers us to bring healing everywhere we go, and through His people, He restores what sin or circumstance has crippled.

Prayer: "Father, I ask that You help me to walk with You through this fast. I pray over 2026 that Your guidance will be my highest desire and Your voice will be in my ear all year long. I do not know what this year holds, but I know You hold me in Your hand. Empower me to bring Your goodness and grace everywhere I go, in Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

3. The Miracle of Holy Fear

— Acts 5

Acts 5:11 (ESV) And great fear came upon the whole church and upon all who heard of these things.

Fasting is not only about seeking power; it is about inviting holiness. When God cleans house, He is preparing room for glory. This moment is a somber reminder that God's work is HOLY work. That means it's set apart for His glory and purpose, not our own.

As we enter day three of this fast, let us remember that ultimately, we belong to the Lord and His plan for the world. Today is a good day to check and consider those nagging desires in your life. Maybe the flesh inside you is longing for something. This could be an idol in your life that God is bringing to the surface to root out for greater impact in your life this year. Ananias and Sapphira were in the church, but their hearts were tied to "looking important" and "seeming more generous" than they were. Today, we do deep work with the Lord on our hearts, asking Him to root out whatever is of us so that all that is left is Himself. May 2026 be the year people see Christ in us!

Prayer: "Father, I know there are displeasing things inside of me. I hate and renounce them today. Send Your Holy Spirit to deeply cleanse my heart and mind. I rely on Your work to take away the false and vain idols of my life and replace them with a clear image of Christ through me to others. Thank You for the pain of this day, the hunger reminds me that You are working on me, and the flesh is dying out. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

4. The Miracle of Breakthrough

— Acts 5

Acts 5:19 (ESV) But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out.

Today, we remember that no chain is too strong for God to break. Obedience had put the Apostles in prison, but prayer brought heaven into the prison. God still opens doors we cannot open, and He still leads His people forward when the enemy tries to lock down their calling. Today is a great day to bring to God those long-sought answers to prayers. Jesus tells us in Mark 6 that prayer and fasting break bondages that regular prayer cannot. You have already gained much in spiritual power thus far in the fast; take ownership of this in Christ and call heaven into your challenges and obstacles. Pray for that lost neighbor, friend, relative, or coworker. Ask that God give you words in the moment to speak to them what they need to hear at the time they need to hear it.

Prayer: “Father, set me free from insecurity and doubt. I know You can do all things, and I know Your promises are sure. I ask for supernatural power to break free from any insecurities or prisons I have in my mind. Your power and Your grace are enough. I declare today that I will walk in faith and obedience to accomplish great things. In Jesus’ Name, amen.”

Personal Reflections

5. The Miracle of Overflow

— Acts 5

Key Verse: Acts 5:11 (ESV) Now many signs and wonders were regularly done among the people by the hands of the apostles.

The early Church did not hide in buildings; they stepped into the streets. When believers walk among the people, the Spirit works among the people. God wants your life to cast a shadow that heals—an influence that blesses beyond words. So today, we examine our relationships. Consider, for a few moments, a relationship that has recently come into your life, and ask God, “What do You want me to do for this person?” Perhaps a relationship has just ended, and it’s time to ask the Lord to give you eyes to see someone new who has been around you, but you did not notice until now.

God does nothing without intention. Those nearest to you are there by Divine coordination, so that you will bring life and peace to them through Christ. Walk in that knowledge today.

Prayer: “Father, I ask for spiritual eyes to see people around me the way You see them. I ask for the opportunity to show Your goodness and grace to them. I pray for miracles to come into their lives and that they know it’s because of You. Help me to cast a shadow of healing everywhere I go. In Jesus’ Name, amen.”

Personal Reflections

6. The Miracle of Unshakable Faith – Acts 5

Acts 7:55 (ESV) But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of

Stephen saw Jesus more clearly in suffering than in comfort. Unshakable faith is not the absence of pressure but the presence of vision. When Jesus becomes the dominant image before your eyes, fear loses its authority. Today, the stomach has been subdued by obedience. The suffering you've endured to this moment has opened your spiritual faculties to perceive what God is doing and how God is working in your life and in the world. Take advantage of that. Tell someone about it. Do not let this process be completely inward. As you go about your day, consider who you can encourage with truth from God's Word. Perhaps find a promise in Scripture and share it with someone else. We build each other up in the faith as we know Scripture, experience God, and speak up.

Prayer: "Father, I want to be a blessing of encouragement today. I want to serve You in practical ways. And Lord, through whatever suffering I experience in 2026, I ask that I see You through it all. I renounce complaining and grumbling over this year, knowing You use all things for my good and Your glory. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

7. The Miracle of Citywide Joy – Acts 5

Acts 8:8 (ESV) So there was much joy in that city.

The Gospel brings joy wherever it goes. Philip stepped into a spiritually oppressed region, and the result was joy that could not be contained. Revival is not just salvation; it is a transformation of atmosphere. Ask God to bring joy to your home, neighborhood, and community. Watch for the conversations God orchestrates, and allow the Holy Spirit to guide your words. Every conversation is an opportunity for cooperation with the Spirit.

Prayer: “Father, today I receive Your presence not only for my life, but for those around me. I ask that Jesus be evident in my words, thoughts, and actions. I pray for my home, fill it with Your presence. I pray for my workplace/school, let my presence bring a deep sense of Your abiding presence in that place. May my life bring joy to those around me so that when they ask what I have, I can share Jesus with them. In Jesus’ Name, amen.”

Personal Reflections

8. The Miracle of Divine Appointment – Acts 8

Acts 8:35 (ESV) Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus.

God orchestrates Divine moments that alter destinies. Philip's obedience intersected with one man's hunger for truth, and the ripple reached nations. Every day holds a potential encounter placed by the Spirit. Today, we focus on letting God lead us in our daily lives. Philip went from a thriving revival to an empty desert to serve ONE person.

Who is the ONE for you? Maybe you're in a lonely season. Philip was there by Divine directive. Yet in that moment, the appointment for the salvation of one man led to a great national awakening. History tells us the Ethiopian Eunuch brought the Gospel to his home nation, and even the queen and many others were saved by his testimony. Today, don't despise quieter times in your life, and remember, every person we impact could have an impact beyond anything we could conceive.

Prayer: "Father, help me to see the ONE today. The ONE You died for, the ONE You brought into my life for this time. Help me to consider that each ONE is made by You and loved by You. Open my mouth to share Jesus with someONE today. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

9. The Miracle of Transformation – Acts 9

Acts 9:5 (ESV) And He said, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting.'

Jesus does not avoid His enemies—He pursues them with transforming grace. No one is beyond the reach of God's interruption. One encounter flipped Saul's identity, mission, and future. God can flip what feels immovable in your life, too.

Perhaps you're having a hard time with a certain person or associate in your life. Remember, they are NOT beyond the grace of God. Today is the day to let this fasting and prayer campaign transform your attitude about them. They really aren't the issue; how we respond to them is the issue. And in Christ, you can have the power of God's love in your heart for them. Take time to ask God to give you a heart of love for those who may hate you.

Prayer: "Father, I declare today that no one is really my enemy. I know we do not wrestle with flesh and blood; we wrestle against spiritual forces of wickedness. I pray the power of heaven down in this difficult relationship. I pray for a breakthrough in my conversations with them. I pray they meet Jesus and He radically changes their life. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

10. The Miracle of Immediate Strength – Acts 9

Acts 9:34 (ESV) And Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; rise and make your bed."

This miracle happened instantly, not gradually. One word from Jesus can give strength where there has been paralysis. There are places in your life God wants to strengthen immediately—your resolve, your purity, your courage. By this time in the fast, you're about to pass day 10. Ten is the number of testing in the Bible. If you've made it this far, you can definitely finish this campaign. So take heart and take courage. Remember, as Aeneas' healing led many to the Lord, so your transformation through this process will have an indelible effect on those around you. Ask for that to be clear for you in 2026.

Prayer: "Father, this year I want my life to be used in great ways to bring many people to Your Son, Jesus. I forsake who I was before I started this fast. I receive a new identity in Christ as a chosen child of God and an instrument of Your goodness to those around me. Heal my heart and make it strong for others. Cause me to bring healing in my conversations and interactions with everyone I meet this year. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

11. The Miracle of Resurrection – Acts 9

Acts 9:40 (ESV) But Peter put them all outside... and said,
"Tabitha, arise."

Jesus revives what the world declares dead. Even faithful people experience seasons where something precious dies—a dream, a relationship, a spiritual fire. Resurrection is still His specialty. Today, we want to spend time thinking of the children. The next generation is always on the enemy's radar. For this reason, every Christian must take up the spiritual fight for the faith and life of the youngest among us. Today is a good day to pray over your children's rooms, their friendships, and their future spouse. If you don't have children, pray for someone's child whom you know. If your children are grown, pray that God gives them spiritually hungry children of their own that will cause them to seek God.

Prayer: "Father, empower me to advance the Gospel in the next generation. Help me to believe for them that the enemy will not have the final word over their lives. Keep me from speaking negatively about young people and children. They need wisdom and guidance. I want our Church and my own life to be a source of those things for them. Today, we lift up every child in our Church, and we pray that You will fill them with the Holy Spirit and bring supernatural life to their minds and bodies. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

12. The Miracle of Open Doors – Acts 10

Key Verse: Acts 10:44 (ESV) While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word.

God removes barriers we didn't even know existed. Cornelius' household represents the breakthrough of grace into unexpected places. As a Jew, Peter was not allowed to fellowship with Gentiles. But the Gospel breaks down human barriers. The Lord called His Church to go to the nations. The Spirit calls us to unfamiliar places to bring Jesus' light and presence to others. Today, consider a group of people you may not naturally spend time with. Ask God to give you a heart for them, to see them as He sees them, and to use you as a blessing to them.

Prayer: "Father, our world is so divided. Sadly, the Church can also be a place of division. Today, I pray that You will make me an instrument of unity and bonding. Help me to cross the cultural or relational barriers that have been set up in society or in my own mind. I want to go to the unfamiliar places and serve those unlike me. Help me to remember that unbelievers are NOT my opponent; they are my opportunity to share Christ's grace with them. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

13. The Miracle of Angelic Help – Acts 12

Acts 12:7 (ESV) And behold, an angel of the Lord stood next to him, and a light shone in the cell.

When the Church prays, heaven moves. God's help often appears suddenly, quietly, and effectively. Light shines in places we thought were sealed in darkness. The Church had just lost James, and now Peter was in jail. All looked hopeless, and the story makes clear that the last thing the praying Church expected was to see Peter show up at their door. God works even when we don't believe! Thank God! Today, consider areas in your life where you pray but don't believe. Jesus is not just interested in answering prayer; He's interested in shaping your heart through doubts and insecurities. Ask Him for faith even in the midst of your questions and doubts.

Prayer: "Father, I want to believe You and trust You in deeper ways than ever before. I pray for Your Holy Spirit to lift my heart in faith and assure me that You will answer prayers when I call. I want to be an example of abounding faith to those around me. I ask that in 2026, I will both believe and ask for more than I ever have before, knowing You can do all things. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

14. The Miracle of Faith Rising – Acts 14

Acts 14:9 (ESV) He listened to Paul speaking, and Paul... seeing that he had faith to be made well.

Sometimes the miracle begins when faith rises just enough to see possibility again. Paul saw faith before the healing happened. God is teaching us to look for what He is already stirring. Our days are ordered by Him. Our lives are directed by His plan. So consider this year as a year of Divine appointments. Nothing is going to happen that does not have the Father's fingerprint on it. Instead of walking aimlessly through the next 11.5 months, walk with intentionality as you see God's hand over your life. The Scripture promises that God works in all things for our good (Romans 8:28) and that we are called according to His purpose (Romans 8:29).

Prayer: "Father, today I believe nothing is going to happen in 2026 that You have not appointed for me. So help me walk with intention and spiritual vision. Help me to see with faith and not doubt. Cause my words to be encouraging and positive for those around me. I pray faith rises in my home and family. I ask for supernatural encounters with those You want to help through me. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

15. The Miracle of Midnight Praise – Acts 16

Acts 16:25 (ESV) About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.

Praise is a weapon! Midnight worship shakes prisons because it declares, “God is greater than my circumstance.” Miracles begin when praise rises where complaints could live. By this time in the fast, you’ve probably worked through a lot of the early grumblings and fleshly distractions. You’re well on your way to the finish line now. So take time today to praise God, even in the midst of unresolved trouble. Praise is never rooted in our circumstances but always rooted in our understanding of God’s goodness. How many times have we seen things that seemed bad, turn out to be God’s plan for our good! Perhaps you could think back to a specific instance and write it down. Then look at whatever problem you currently have and name it for God’s glory and purpose in your life.

Prayer: “Father, I praise You today for who YOU are. I refuse to respond to my problems with complaint and grumbling. I know You are greater than my greatest trouble and that You will work even in this situation. I pray Your kingdom comes through this challenge, and I thank You for bringing me this far. I pray over all of my challenges in this year ahead; may they bring me CLOSER to You and not further away. In Jesus’ Name, amen.”

Personal Reflections

16. The Miracle of Household Salvation – Acts 16

Acts 16:31 (ESV) Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.

The Gospel is not individualistic—it aims for households. God wants to rescue entire family trees and rewrite generational stories. Today is the day we are all going to pray together for our families. Consider that many of us have wayward children; pray for them, that God the Father will draw them back to Jesus. Name them now in prayer before the Lord and ask that He send them situations and people who bring them back to Himself. Now this is important! If God brings them trouble, don't immediately seek to rescue them. Let God use that trouble to wake them up to what could be theirs in Christ.

Prayer: “Father, we lift up lost loved ones in our Church family today. We ask the Holy Spirit to convict them of sin, to bring them to Jesus. We pray they will lose the taste of disobedience and rebellion. We pray that their lives will not be comfortable apart from You. And we pray they will hear the Gospel and it will pierce their heart and convict them of sin. We agree together over our homes, may each family of our Church bring You glory. In Jesus’ Name, amen.”

Personal Reflections

17. The Miracle of Extraordinary Power – Acts 19

Acts 19:11 (ESV) And God was doing extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul.

Ephesus was a very spiritually dark city. YET, it was a place where one of the book of Acts' greatest revivals occurred. Entire industries were shut down because the Gospel set people free from idolatry and sorcery. When God moves, society changes. The miraculous in Ephesus was not normal—it was “extraordinary”—because God was greater than the darkness. Today, we can look at our nation or region and think it's beyond hope. That's not true! God's Gospel still has power, and God's Holy Spirit can still reawaken the lost. By this time in our fast, we have already laid much groundwork for revival; now is the time to press in for greater revival than we even thought possible.

Prayer: “Father, revive us that we might bring Jesus to our area! We lift up this city to You, oh Lord, and we ask that spiritual awakening occur in every place. We believe You for societal transformation as hearts are made right with You through the Gospel. We pray against the idols of our community. We pray against any spiritual stronghold over this city. And we pray for a release from those strongholds over the people so they might receive Jesus and be changed. Give us our city, Lord, we ask You. In Jesus' Name, amen.”

Personal Reflections

18. The Miracle of Genuine Authority – Acts 19

Acts 19:15 (ESV) But the evil spirit answered them, "Jesus I know, and Paul I recognize, but who are you?"

Authority cannot be imitated; it must be genuine. Power flows from knowing God through Christ, His Son, not performance or presentation. Think about this: the enemy recognizes authenticity. How important it is to examine our lives and make sure our faith is in Christ for our salvation. Today, we are reminded that external forms of religion do not secure our standing in Christ. As we near the end of this fast, let us pray that we might be set free from seeking to perform for others or to impress others with outward realities, and that we might keep our hearts' internal focus on the Lord and His great love for us.

Prayer: "Father, I want my faith to be real. I want to know You in the inner person of my heart and set Christ apart as Lord in my life. I ask that You set me free from seeking the approval of others or seeking attention by what is on the outside of my life. You do not need me to be impressive; You want me to be responsive to Your voice. I ask for a deep commitment in my heart for 2026, so that I settle on who I am in Christ alone. Give me freedom from the vain worries of life and set my eyes on things above (Colossians 3:1-3). In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

19. The Miracle of Second Chances – Acts 20

Acts 20:10 (ESV) But Paul went down and bent over him... and said, "Do not be alarmed, for his life is in him."

God restores what we drop. Even in ministry and serving, fatigue and distraction can cost us. Yet God is merciful, reviving what appears lost. The story of Eutychus is also a picture of how often young people can disengage from what the Church is doing because they are on the outside of the movement. Today is another day to consider the next generation or transformational impact. Our children and teens are not the FUTURE of the Church; they are the Church now. We must include them, use them, lead them, guide them, challenge them, and instruct them. So often, the greatest need for serving in a church is in the children's ministry. Let's pray that isn't the case for us! Let's pray vision, wisdom, and vitality into our Church's next-generation ministries.

Prayer: "Father, raise up the children and youth of our Church with power in the Holy Spirit. Help us to consider them part of what You are doing now, and not a nuisance or inconvenience. Jesus, You called the children to Yourself. Empower our Church to be a vehicle to do that in our day and in our region. We pray for spiritual growth for them, and we pray for spiritual wisdom and gifts in their lives. May they walk in areas of leadership and impact all the days of their life as You call them to Your purpose and plans. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

20. The Miracle of Protection – Acts 28

Acts 28:5 (ESV) He, however, shook off the creature into the fire and suffered no harm.

What should kill you cannot touch you when God's hand is on your life. Not every attack is preventable, but every attack is survivable. The viper that gripped Paul's hand is a picture of the subtle attacks of Satan who seeks to distract us from God's work. This far into the fast has no doubt revealed many of the small things we let distract us from God. Let us set our hearts anew in 2026 to make sure we keep our focus on His purpose in our lives. A life without focus will wander the secondary alleys of insignificance and waste. Pray that God keeps you on the path He has laid out for you.

Prayer: "Father, I want to end this fast strong, with a purity of focus in my life that won't go away. I pray for focus and attention on things that matter. I also pray that I see the vipers before they bite. I pray that I will avoid false paths and evil plans. I pray that I will shake off the secondary realities that seek to waste my time and hold my attention. Give me a deep sense of purpose over this year so that I make every decision with that in mind. Help me to avoid useless babble, ignorant conversations, and senseless quarrels. I give You my mind today; make it laser focused on Jesus every single day (Hebrews 12:1-2). In Jesus' Name, amen."

Personal Reflections

21. The Miracle of Finishing Strong – Acts 28

Acts 28:31 (ESV) Proclaiming the kingdom of God... with all boldness and without hindrance.

The final miracle of Acts is not healing or deliverance—it is perseverance. God's mission is unstoppable, even in chains. The Spirit empowers us not just to begin but to finish strong. Consider how much spiritual help, influence, anointing, and bondage-breaking power you have just prayed into your life! Remember that nothing holds back the work or Word of God. He is unstoppable through us, His Church. You are NOT the same person who started this 20 days ago. You are different, and God has done it. Take time to write down some of the greatest things you've heard, received, or learned through this process. Don't let yourself forget.

Prayer: "Father, I thank You for the help to have made it this far. And now I know the journey to the rest of my life in You is just beginning, but now it's going to be different. I receive blessings and power into my life and my year. I reject negativity and falsehood. I renounce who I was and receive a new level of glory in Jesus' Name (2 Corinthians 3:18). Today, I close this fast with a heart full of thanksgiving for what has taken place. May Your power flow through me in what I see, hear, do, and say in 2026. Your kingdom come in this life, as it is in heaven. In Jesus' Name, amen!"
